In 2016-17 losses to fraud in the NHS were estimated at £1.25 billion a year – enough money to pay for over 40,000 staff nurses.

This is taxpayers' money that is taken away from patient care and falls into the hands of criminals.

The NHS Counter Fraud Authority (NHSCFA) is a new organisation tasked to lead the fight against fraud in the NHS.

When we say 'fraud', we mean a range of economic crimes, such as fraud, bribery and corruption. Those who commit these crimes against the NHS are a minority, but they are having a serious impact on us all.
